Jacques PERCEBOIS has received the "2006 Award" given by the IAEE (International Association for Energy Economists) in June 2007 (Conference at Florence).

Jacques PERCEBOIS is the author of 146 papers published in various Academic Reviews (French, English, German, Spanish) and of 10 books (particularly a book entitled "Economie de l'Energie" Economica, 692 Pages, published in 1989, and a more recent book written with Jean-Pierre HANSEN, Professor at the University of Louvain and at Ecole Polytechnique (Paris), former Chairman of Electrabel; this book published in November 2010 is entitled "Energie: économie et politiques"; préface de Marcel Boiteux and Avant-Propos of Jean Tirole; 780 pages, Editions de Boeck, Bruxelles). This book has received two prizes (AFSE 2011 and AEE 2011). A second edition has been published in May 2015 (830 p).

Jacques PERCEBOIS was the founder of the Network "MONDER" (Mondialisation, Energie et Environnement) in collaboration with Professor Antoine AYOUB (GREEN, Laval University, Québec) (15 institutions working about energy economics are member of this network).
